

"Oh no! Applications opened yesterday and mine's not in!"

DON'T PANIC

Applications will be analyzed in monthly batches, *not necessarily first-in, first-out.*

We're more likely to approve a well put-together application than a rushed one.



Governor Newsom Signs SB 156 (and other) Broadband Legislation to Help Bridge the Digital Divide



Middle Mile, \$3.25 billion

- Build, operate and maintain an open-access, state-owned middle mile network.

Last Mile, \$2 billion

- Set up last-mile broadband connections that will connect homes and businesses with local networks.

Loan Loss Reserve, \$750 million

- Loan loss reserve fund to enable local governments and nonprofits to secure financing for broadband infrastructure.

Local Agency Technical Assistance, \$50 million

- Technical assistance to local governments to prepare for broadband implementation.

California Advanced Services Fund (CASF) program changes

Wide-ranging changes to the CASF Public Utilities Code section 281 statute

Decision (D.) 22-02-026 (approved Feb. 24, 2022)

- Established the Local Agency Technical Assistance grant program
- \$50 million for eligible local governments and Tribal governments* to facilitate deployment of last-mile broadband infrastructure projects.
- "These grants will support local agencies and Tribes in their efforts to expand broadband to families and communities where sufficient service and Internet access are lacking."
- "Commission ... intends to periodically review and adjust the program via resolution, including the scope of reimbursable activities, to ensure that the funds are efficiently and effectively disbursed."

* 10 Percent of the program is reserved for Tribal governments, plus if that reserve is exhausted, 10 percent of the unawarded remainder will also be reserved.



Local Agency Technical Assistance Timeline



- Formal public process and venue for CASF Public Housing, Infrastructure, Consortia, and Adoption Accounts as well as Technical Assistance and Loan Loss Reserve Account. CPUC *California Advanced Services Fund (CASF) Proceeding* (R. 20-08-021)
- Local Agency Technical Assistance Funds to be awarded by December 31, 2024, unless demand for funds is exhausted sooner.

Who is Eligible for Technical Assistance?

A “local agency” is any local government entity authorized by law to provide broadband internet access service, including:

- a) city;
- b) county, including a county service area;
- c) community service district;
- d) public utility district;
- e) municipal utility district;
- f) joint powers authority;
- g) local educational agency (as defined by [Education Code section 47640](#));
- h) sovereign tribal government; and
- i) electrical cooperative (as defined by [Public Utilities Code section 2776](#))



What about Metropolitan Planning Organizations, Councils of Government, etc.?

- It's complicated. Decision **specifically** declined to declare them as eligible entities, so we recommend a member jurisdiction be the official applicant. A MPO/CoG can be contracted party.

Eligible Uses of Technical Assistance

Pre-construction costs towards developing broadband network projects that benefit unserved and underserved* Californians. Examples:

- Environmental, feasibility, engineering design studies or reports
- Needs assessments, market studies, broadband plans, business plans
- Forming a Joint Powers Authority

Reimbursement for work products that support local agencies in providing broadband service to communities. Examples:

- Consultant and community-based organization services secured to complete reimbursed work products.
- Local agency staff may also conduct work if **incremental** to regular roles.

* “Unserved and underserved” means one or more households or businesses that are not currently served by a wireline connection that reliably delivers at least 25 Mbps download speed and 3 Mbps of upload speed.

How much can be awarded, and by whom?

\$50 million total budget, to be awarded by Dec. 31, 2024.


- Awards up to \$1 million per agency per fiscal year

CPUC staff determination (aka “ministerial review” in the CPUC Decision)

- Up to \$500,000 per local agency or tribal government *per fiscal year*
- Staff may recommend *any* application for resolution

Commission determination via **resolution** after public comment

- Up to \$1 million, via a Commission vote on a formal resolution
- 30-day public comment period



Funding Decisions & Kick-Off

- Decisions are communicated via email
- Submit required forms within 30 days of award
 - Consent Form (accepts grant)
 - Payee Data Record (for taxes)
 - Assurances with Title IV of the Civil Rights Act (federal)
- Begin work!

Grantee Reporting

Reporting is required for pre-construction technical assistance in service of "developing broadband network projects that benefit unserved and underserved Californians."

- Work Product Payment Requests with Invoices
- Final Report / Final Work Product
- Final Payment Request and Completion Report

Recordkeeping to comply with rules as outlined in LATA Grantee Manual, CPUC Decision 22-02-026, and U.S. Treasury Rules for State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds.

How Reimbursement Works

- LATA funding is for reimbursable work products.
- Provide invoice with work product so we can approve payment.
- Work product examples:
 - Engineering or Feasibility Study
 - Broadband Plan
 - Network Design



Grant Process

Step 1. Proposal

- Download application at <https://bitly.CPUCLATA>
- Complete application and supporting documents
- Submit materials to Broadband.TechAssist@cpuc.ca.gov

Step 2. Review

- Staff review applications
- May request incomplete items via email
- Approve/deny grants, inform applicants, post online

CPUC Staff

Step 3. Project

- Sign and return forms
- Conduct project with a consultant and/or staff
- Submit work products with payment requests
- Final report and reimbursement

Local Agency Technical Assistance grant applications will be accepted beginning on August 1, 2022! See the [Important Information for Grantees](#) section below for the application and new information.

About the Program

The CPUC established the Local Agency Technical Assistance (LATA) grant program for eligible pre-construction work facilitating broadband network projects to areas in need. The program has a \$50 million budget for eligible local agencies and tribal entities in California, including a \$5 million set aside for tribes.

Funding Focus

Technical assistance grants support tribes and local agencies in their efforts to expand broadband to communities lacking sufficient Internet. Grant recipients are reimbursed for eligible pre-construction expenses to provide last-mile connections to unserved and underserved communities. Examples of reimbursable expenses:

- Consultant or staff time for conducting needs assessments, environmental and engineering studies, network design, and broadband strategic plans.
- Costs incurred in forming a joint powers authority for the purpose of bringing broadband to areas in need of sufficient Internet connections.

- Local government agencies in California are authorized by law to provide broadband service.
- California tribes with or without federal recognition. Tribes may also continue to apply to the CPUC's existing [Tribal Technical Assistance](#) broadband grant program, which is being maintained as a separate program.




