The City of Rancho Santa Margarita appreciates the opportunity to provide comments to "Rulemaking 18-10-007" that will implement requirements for electric power utilities to develop wildfire mitigation plans pursuant to Senate Bill 901.

Cities have long been at the forefront of wildfire and disaster preparedness and response. With the trends of increasing wildfire severity, strengthening safety, and other policies to protect against these disasters are critical. We request that power utilities coordinate with local agencies in their service territory when developing wildfire mitigation plans.
